Congratulations! The AIHA Laboratory Accreditation Programs (AIHA-LAP), LLC's Analytical Accreditation Board (AAB) has approved American Analytical Laboratories, Inc. as an accredited Industrial Hygiene laboratory.

Laboratory accreditation shall be maintained by continued compliance with IHLAP requirements (see Policy Modules 2B and 6), which includes proficient participation in all demonstrations of proficiency for all Fields of Testing (FoTs) for which the laboratory is accredited. An accredited laboratory that wishes to expand into a new FoT must submit an updated accreditation application to AIHA-LAP, LLC for review by the AAB. Any changes in ownership, laboratory location, personnel, FoTs/Methods, or significant procedural changes shall be reported to AIHA-LAP, LLC in writing within twenty (20) business days of the change. The accreditation certificate is the property of AIHA-LAP, LLC and must be returned to us, should your laboratory withdraw or be removed from the IHLAP.
